Ulrike Kluge is a Professor of Psychological and Medical Integration and Migration Studies and both the Head of the Center of Cross-Cultural Psychiatry and Psychotherapy (ZIPP) and the Research Division Intercultural Migration and Care Research at the Department of Psychiatry and Neurosciences at the Charité Universitätsmedizin in Berlin.

Additionally, she is also head of the Department of Migration, Mental and Physical Health and Health Promotion at the Berlin Institute of for Integration and Migration Research (BIM) at the Humboldt University of Berlin.

Her research interests lie in critical migration studies in the fields of medicine and psychology, transcultural psychiatry and intercultural psychotherapy. Ulrike Kluge, who is also a group analyst, currently heads various inter- and transdisciplinary research and intervention projects on migration, flight and health and on intercultural psychosocial resources.
